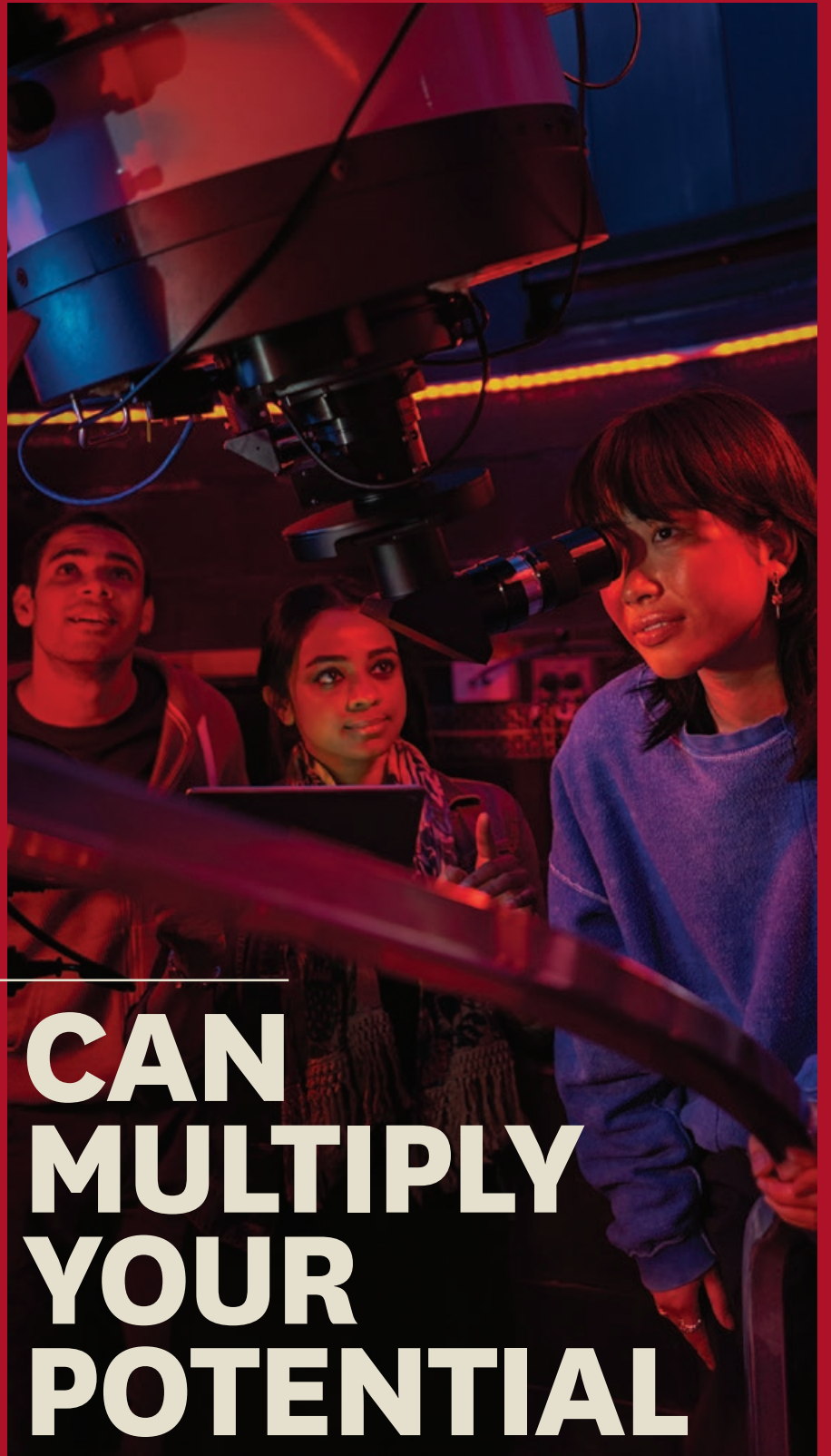

Onshore international students must reside in Australia for the purpose of their studies, be physically present to attend classes and complete their course, and satisfy other key requirements.

Macquarie University maintains rigorous standards to ensure international students receive a world-class education. All qualifications are regulated under the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF), and Macquarie University operates within the Education Services for Overseas Students (ESOS) framework, which protects your rights and ensures the quality of your experience.

YOU ARE CONSIDERED AN INTERNATIONAL STUDENT IF YOU ARE NOT ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:

- An Australian citizen
- A New Zealand citizen
- A permanent resident of Australia

HOW TO APPLY

You can apply for undergraduate degrees through the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC) if you are an international student currently undertaking one of the following qualifications:

- Australian Year 12 (in or outside Australia)
- International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma
- New Zealand National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) Level 3

All other international students should apply directly to Macquarie University online or through an authorised agent.

Approved representatives can help you with your application and may offer package plans to add value to the standard package. Macquarie only accepts applications from official representatives under contract to provide professional and reliable advice.

If you're granted permanent residency after you've applied, you'll need to reapply as a domestic student. Contact UAC or contact us directly for further guidance and information.

STUDENTS UNDER 18

If you're 17, you'll need to meet additional requirements around accommodation, welfare and guardianship. We can help guide you through this process.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Macquarie requires that an applicant's English language proficiency is appropriate for the linguistic demands of their course. You may satisfy English language requirements if you've completed an Australian Year 12 certificate, at least one year of full-time tertiary study in Australia, or comparable tertiary study in a country of qualification. You can also complete a Direct Entry program at Macquarie University College or an approved English for Academic Purposes program from a recognised provider. SCHOLARSHIPS AND SUPPORT

Macquarie University offers various scholarships for onshore international students, including the Vice-Chancellor's International Scholarship and our Early Acceptance Scholarship, alongside pathway-specific grants such as the Macquarie University College Scholarship. You may also be eligible for an Equity Scholarship. For a full list visit mq.edu.au/international-scholarships

The annual number of scholarship recipients may vary according to the availability of funding and the number of eligible candidates, and will only be confirmed when an offer letter is made. Course exclusions may apply.

VISA AND HEALTH COVER

To study in Australia, you'll need a student visa. You'll require a **Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE)** from Macquarie and proof of **Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)**. LEARN THE LINGO

ATAR

The Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) is a number between 00.00 and 99.95 that indicates your rank relative to all students in your age group (that is, students aged 16 to 20 years), not your Year 12 group. The average ATAR is usually about 70.00.

UAC

The Universities Admissions Centre (UAC) receives and processes most applications for admission into university in New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory.

SINGLE BACHELOR DEGREE

A single bachelor degree typically involves three or four years of full-time study in one specific area. While you'll have the flexibility to study units from a range of different areas, your degree ultimately focuses on one main area of study.

UNIT

A unit is what we call a subject. Most full-time students take four units – each worth a fixed number of credit points – each session. Each unit usually requires about 12 hours of study each week.

SESSION

A session is just like a school term. We have two main sessions: Session 1 (February to June) and Session 2 (August to November).

CREDIT POINT

To graduate, you need to have completed the specified number of credit points for your degree. For many degrees, this is 240 credit points; however, some degrees require the completion of a higher number of credit points.

SELECTION RANK

The selection rank considers your ATAR or equivalent rank plus any adjustment factors you're eligible for. You can combine our adjustment factor schemes to receive additional points for most of our degrees.

UNDERGRADUATE

An undergraduate student is one who is studying their first degree – known as a bachelor degree. Once you've been awarded your bachelor degree, you become a graduate.

DOUBLE BACHELOR DEGREE

A double bachelor degree involves studying two complementary or completely different degrees. A double degree increases your career flexibility and can be completed faster than two single degrees.

CORE ZONE

Your degree's core zone provides the focus of your preferred area of study and consists of all the units you'll need to complete to meet your degree's requirements.

LECTURE

A lecture is where you'll learn most of your degree content. Lecture length varies from unit to unit, but most run for one or two hours. Some take place in large theatres, while others are in smaller rooms.

PREREQUISITE

A prerequisite is a school subject – such as HSC Mathematics – that must be completed, or a requirement that must be satisfied, before you can enrol in a particular unit.

EARLY ENTRY

We offer one early entry scheme through which international students can receive an early offer before they sit their final Year 12 exams. Offers are based on Year 11 results and other criteria and subject to the award of their Year 12 qualification.

MAJOR

A major is a specific sequence of study that allows you to explore your interests in greater depth. About half of our degrees offer majors. You may be able to combine two different areas with a double major.

ELECTIVE

An elective forms part of a degree's flexible zone. Electives can be undertaken from within or outside your area of study, allowing you to personalise your degree by following your passions.

TUTORIAL

A tutorial, or 'tute', generally comprises 20-30 students and is an opportunity to ask your tutor questions and talk about the degree material with other students.

ASSUMED KNOWLEDGE

Some units assume that you have certain knowledge and skills from previous study, such as the HSC. Introductory units and bridging courses are available if you do not have the assumed knowledge.

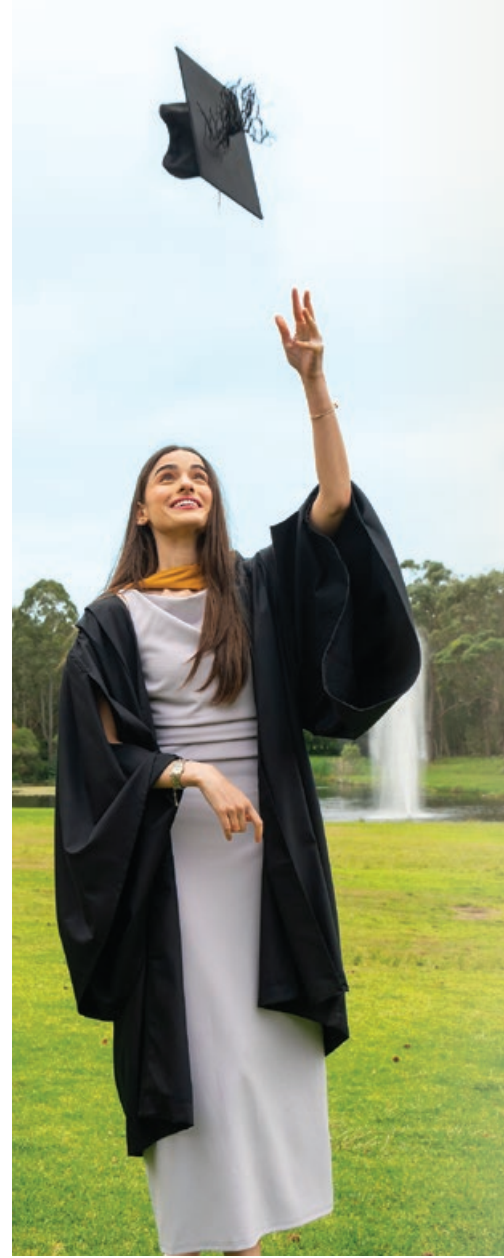



You could receive an early entry offer to study at Macquarie if you have performed well academically in Year 11 and demonstrate leadership skills, personal development and dedication through your extracurricular activities, casual work experience, sport or community involvement.

PATHWAY PROGRAMS

Diplomas

Diplomas are equivalent to the first year of a bachelor degree. If you successfully complete your diploma and meet the entry requirements, you can progress directly into the second year of an undergraduate degree without losing any time, as you'll receive credit for the units you've completed.

Standard Foundation Program and Intensive Program

Our Standard Foundation and Intensive Programs provide you with the skills to kickstart your studies in a wide range of degrees in either two or four terms. Successfully complete your program and meet your chosen degree's entry requirements, and you'll secure a place in the first year of that degree.

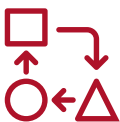
DOUBLE BACHELOR DEGREES

Plus, having qualifications in two fields gives you the flexibility to pivot if your career goals change over time.



MAJORS

Majors give you the freedom to specialise in an area that excites you most. They're your chance to explore a field from many angles, develop comprehensive expertise and gain practical skills that set you apart in a competitive job market. CORE AND FLEXIBLE ZONES
